Leadership Highlights

Board and Committee Activities: Colony Leaders Meeting Alberta Education Minister meeting, updates on new policy. Annual Board Workshop with Stu Henry, E-Cubed Session and Principal Highlights on Wildly Important Goals implementation in their schools.

Staff Leadership Focus: In February, our leadership initiatives were diverse and impactful. Coaching sessions with Stu Henry strengthened administration. We provided crucial support to communities and engaged actively with Alberta Education. The Learning Leadership Team (LLT) excelled with workshops, and we prioritized teacher development through new workshops and school visits. The Teachers Convention, Sylvan Lake school tour, budget discussions, and numeracy planning showcased our commitment to excellence.

Gus Wetter and Botha School Trustee Visits - Trustees interacted informally with students, observing classes without formal presentations. This approach facilitated genuine connections, offering insights into the learning environment. The commitment to balanced visits ensures a positive and collaborative understanding between trustees and the school community.

Community Engagement Followup - Clearview Public Schools has planned community engagement conversations for every one of their community schools. To date, Trustees and Superintendent Leys have met with the communities of Botha, Brownfield, Coronation & Gus Wetter. These conversations provide community members and parents an excellent opportunity to have their voices heard and assist in the development of Clearview's priorities for 2024-25.

2024-25 Learning Calendar Consultation - Clearview's Board and administration asked staff, parents and school councils to provide input on two proposed calendar options for next year. The Board has selected Draft A, which can be viewed by clicking [HERE](#).

Field Trip Approvals - The Board of Trustees approved Gus Wetter School and Wm. E Hay Stettler Secondary Campus Archery Trips for the National competition in Moose Jaw on April 20-21, 2024. Additionally, the Gus Wetter Experience Canada Exchange to Butler, QC, from April 10-17, 2024, was given final approval. Open to students in grades 7-9, this exchange aims to explore Canada's history and heritage, fostering connections with students from different cultures. The Board emphasizes the educational value of these experiences, acknowledging the enriched learning opportunities travel provides to students.

Enrollment Distribution and Projections - In the annual Enrolment Distribution report, Secretary Treasurer Mauricio Reyes provide insightful data to the Board of Trustees. For the 2024-25 School Year, Clearview is anticipating 2351 students. Challenges in data consistency are acknowledged, particularly relating to changes in reporting metrics by the Government of Alberta.

Community Initiative Programs Update - Coronation school has started work on their Inclusive playground. Erskine Social and Recreation Society, has began working on the project and concrete will be poured in the summer.
