Leadership Highlights

In our recent staff leadership updates, we've made significant strides in professional development and organizational planning. Key activities include Stu Henry's coaching sessions, planning for the 2024-25 division PD, literacy and numeracy PD planning, and the Teacher-Board Liaison Committee Meeting. We've also focused on hiring an administrative assistant and recognizing achievements during our Recognition Night and the Edwin Parr Award celebration. Additionally, the Wellness Day PD and Coronation Graduation were notable events.

Clearview Education Plan 2024-27

The Clearview School Division's Education Plan for 2024-2027 focuses on Literacy, Numeracy, and Student Engagement, with a new emphasis on Inclusive Education. It introduces professional development shifts from literacy theory to practical instructional strategies for grades 4-9 and enhances numeracy through Division-wide common final assessments for grades 7-12. An Inclusive Education Consultant role supports tailored educational approaches. These strategic directions aim to foster a high-quality learning environment where every student can succeed.

GWS Experience Canada Trip

Grade 7 & 8 students presented their week-long exchange with Bedford, Quebec. Highlights included exploring Quebec's narrow, white gravel roads and discovering milk in bags. They visited the Cosmodome, an old-time farm, and enjoyed a day at the arcade. In Alberta, they toured the legislative building, West Edmonton Mall, and Jasper. Memorable experiences included the Sugar Shack, Drumheller Museum, and a Montreal Canadiens Alumni game. Students shared that the trip was enriching and recommended it for future students.

2024-25 Spring Budget

Clearview Public Schools has outlined a \$38 million operating budget for 2024-25, projecting a \$198,559 surplus due to higher transportation funding. Key capital investments include \$1.4 million for transportation enhancements and \$0.3 million for technology upgrades. The budget allocates over \$17.5 million in instructional grants to schools, with an increase of \$182,000 for inclusive education. Despite stable enrolment and staffing, concerns remain about funding for operations and maintenance. Extensive stakeholder consultations informed the budget process.

Erskine School and Wm. E Hay Stettler Secondary Campus Trips

The Board of Trustees has provided preliminary approval for Erskine School's educational trip to Quebec. This enriching journey, scheduled for students to explore historical and cultural sites in Montreal, Quebec City, and Ottawa, aims to enhance language skills and promote independence. This decision supports academic growth and offers students a fun, transformative travel experience.

The Board of Trustees has also provided preliminary approval the New York City fine arts trip for Wm E Hay Stettler Secondary Campus. Scheduled for March 26 to 30, 2026, this enriching tour will immerse students in the vibrant fine arts scene, enhancing their education through curated experiences in art, drama, music and fashion.
