Are you thinking of a career in the Animal Sciences Industry?

In 2024-2025 we will continue to offer the full Veterinary Technical Assistant Certificate (VTA) with Olds College. We have been thrilled with the growth of this program in dual credit over the past two years with the continued offering of the VTA Calgary cohort and the two newer Central Alberta cohorts to bring us to a total of 90 students annually completing this certificate.

What is the Veterinary Technical Certificate (VTA)?

Visit the <u>Olds College website</u> for a full description. This certificate is like the Health Care Aide Certificate for human medicine.

Students will have 5 courses that they have to complete and achieve a minimum GPA average of 2.00 (approximately 62%) to receive the certification.

- o AHT1050 Introduction to the Veterinary Profession
- VTA6010 Small Animal Restraint and Handling
- o <u>VTA6020</u> Principles of Veterinary Clinical Procedures
- o VTA6030 Veterinary Equipment and Instrumentation
- o VTA6040 Veterinary Patient Preparation and Husbandry

What is a VTA? What will I learn and do?

- Assists the DVM/RVT
- Patient handling & restraint, Biosecurity of the hospital, Patient husbandry
- Equipment and protocol maintenance
- Surgical instrument & pack preparation
- Team & client communication
- Medical terminology

What do I need to take this Veterinary Technical Certificate (VTA)?

Students applying must be on track to complete by the end of Grade 12 the below courses:

- 50% or better in English Language Arts 30-1 or 30-2
- 50% or better in Math 20-1 or 20-2
- 50% or better in one of the Biology 20, Chemistry 20 or Science 20
- Meet the English Language Proficiency Requirement

Students must have completed:

HCS3000 Workplace Safety Systems

Students must demonstrate the below student behaviors currently in high school:

- Excellent attendance
- Strong organization of time and homework completion

Reliability to follow through with commitments

What will it look like in 2024-2025 when I take this certificate?

The courses will be split up by semester and will be a combination of online learning (some set time and mostly asynchronous time) and on campus learning at Olds College/other industry location scheduled across a semester. i.e. 4-5 Saturdays on campus across semester one to complete lab learning. These labs are a mandatory component. Students should be prepared that these courses will take up the same amount of time per semester as a five credit core high school course. Students should work with their schools to have one block each semester set aside for these courses.

- 1st and 2nd semesters in the 2024-2025 school year will be used
- The courses will run for 15 weeks in each semester in a blended online and in person model.
- The online portion of each course will largely be asynchronous with minimal synchronous time expected.
- Each semester students will be required to be in person at Olds College 4 to 5 Saturdays for approximately 5 hours of lab learning on each date
- The AHT 1050 course needed in this certificate is to be taken online (full asynchronous) outside of the other schedule for the VTA courses. You may already have this or will need to take this in the Summer 2024, Fall 2024, Winter 2025 or Summer 2025.
- Fall 2024 (late September through December)
 - o VTA 6020
 - o VTA 6030
- Winter 2025 (February through May)
 - o VTA 6040
 - o VTA 6010
- Each course will earn students 5 high school credits for a total of 25 high school credits at the thirty level.
- These courses make up about 135-160 hours of learning. Students should adjust their semesters accordingly to allow for in school time to complete their course work to high levels.
- Upon successful completion of the 5 courses, students will earn the Veterinary
 Technical Assistant Certificate (VTA) with Olds College which will be able to be used
 on your resume to begin working in the clinic and shelter settings.

Is there a cost to the program?

The program tuition cost is free to all students as this is covered by your school division. (The cost of this program to adult students after high school is approximately \$3700.00)

Students are responsible for the purchase of the program learning materials and Personal Protective Equipment, scrubs, lab wraps (approximately \$350).

Students are also responsible for the cost of transportation to and from Olds College campus for lab instruction.

How will achieving this certificate benefit me?

Successful graduates of the Veterinary Technical Assistant program will earn:

- 25 high school credits
- An Olds College Veterinary Technical Assistant Certificate to use to start working immediately in industry

Students who successfully complete the VTA certificate will be eligible to participate in the Olds College Convocation once they meet all of the requirements and will receive an official parchment in the mail.

Other benefits to consider:

- AHT 1050, one of the courses in the VTA certificate, is also part of the VMR certificate and the Veterinary Technology Diploma, so students would not have to repeat that course if they took either one of those programs
- As per the U of C's DVM Applicant Manual: Consistent with UCVM's mandate, preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate attributes compatible with successful careers in veterinary practice that support rural development and sustainability, and for careers related to our areas of emphasis. While no specific animal or veterinary related experience is required for these applications, such experience is an asset. Understanding of the veterinary profession and animal industries relevant to the applicant's career interests is expected. This can be obtained through practical experiences or through other means such as achieving the VTA Certificate and starting to work in the industry.
- The VTA certificate would look fantastic on a resume and allow you to get work
 experience or an internship with a veterinary clinic. This experience will be extremely
 beneficial, and in some cases, can help with admission to programs like the Veterinary
 Technology Diploma. This work experience would also benefit them in terms of

- confirming that they want a career in animal health before they commit to a longer program like the Veterinary Technology Diploma and the DVM program.
- Having exposure to the post-secondary environment can help prepare high school students to be successful when they enter post-secondary in the future.
- Having previous post-secondary coursework (5 classes) will result in an increase (+ 1%) in a students' high school average at Olds College, which could assist them in gaining admission to the Veterinary Technology Diploma.


