Leadership Highlights

During the recent board meeting, Superintendent Scot Leys outlined various leadership activities aimed at fostering educational excellence across Clearview Public Schools. Key initiatives included strategic visits by trustees to multiple schools and leadership coaching sessions. These efforts emphasize the district's commitment to nurturing leadership skills among educators and align with strategic goals to improve educational outcomes and administrative effectiveness.

3-Year Capital Plan Approval

The board reviewed and approved the 2025-28 Capital Plan, focusing on long-term infrastructure development to enhance learning environments. This plan includes significant updates to the middle school facilities in Stettler, informed by a comprehensive value-scoping analysis. The plan is designed to ensure that educational facilities can meet current and future needs, reflecting a proactive approach to supporting the division's educational goals through thoughtful investment in infrastructure.

2025-26 Clearview Calendar Approval

The [2025-26 academic calendar](#) was approved, establishing key operational and instructional dates. This calendar is structured to optimize educational outcomes, accommodating professional development for staff and aligning with regulatory requirements. It includes all critical dates such as the start and end of school terms, holidays, and professional development days, ensuring that the school year is effectively planned to support both student learning and staff preparation.

Bus Purchases

The board approved the procurement of two new 53-passenger buses, emphasizing the division's commitment to enhancing its transportation fleet. The decision followed a detailed evaluation process ensuring the buses meet safety, efficiency, and cost-effectiveness criteria. This update is part of Clearview's ongoing strategy to provide safe and reliable transportation for students, facilitating better access to education while upholding standards for fiscal responsibility and operational efficiency.
