

Subject: Update for Families – ATA Strike Vote Results

Dear Clearview Families,

We are writing to provide an update following our recent communication regarding the Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) and their supervised strike vote held from June 5 to 8.

We have now received the [results](#) of that vote: teachers voted 95% in favour of supporting strike action. While this does not mean that teachers are immediately going on strike, the vote gives the ATA the authority to initiate job action at any point within the next 120 days, provided they give at least 72 hours' notice.

This continues to be part of the provincial bargaining process between the ATA and the Teacher Employer Bargaining Association (TEBA), which includes representatives from the Alberta government and all school divisions. Clearview Public Schools is not directly involved in these provincial negotiations but is carefully following developments and provincial guidance.

We understand this uncertainty may raise questions, especially with important year-end activities such as graduations, diploma exams, provincial achievement tests, and field trips. While we do not yet know how this situation will unfold, we are actively preparing for different scenarios and will work to minimize disruption for students and families wherever possible.

We will continue to share information as soon as it becomes available. In the meantime, thank you for your continued patience and support.
