Leadership Highlights

Superintendent Scot Leys provided updates on school visits, hiring progress, and planning for the 2025–26 professional development day. Key initiatives include curriculum implementation, FOIP/social media changes, and transportation discussions. The Coronation Innovate group of students shared their award-winning community-building project.

Election Planning

The Board reviewed details for the upcoming 2025 School Board Election. Trustees confirmed standard voting procedures and authorized joint election coordination with municipalities.

Coronation Student Innovation Challenge

A special highlight came from students at Coronation School, who presented their awardwinning project from the C2U Expo Student Innovation Challenge at Grant MacEwan University. Their project, titled "Bridging the Gap Between Generations," focused on strengthening intergenerational relationships in their community. After weeks of research and stakeholder engagement, the students earned first place and a \$1,000 prize to help implement their ideas. The Board congratulated the team—Sandy, Nikki, Bethany, Aislyn, Mena—and staff mentors Mrs. Goodbrand and Miss Fearnley for their outstanding work and community impact.

Grants & Curriculum Updates

The Board received an update on ongoing curriculum work and grant submissions. Grades 7–12 curriculum implementation will roll out in phases, with updated timelines now extending into 2026–27 to support manageable change. Minor adjustments to K–6 curriculum are also underway, focusing on reducing outcomes and clarifying language based on teacher feedback. The division has submitted or received several grants, including Literacy/Numeracy support, dual credit funding, and new opportunities aligned with the Ministerial Priority and Curriculum Support programs. These grants will enhance learning experiences and help address instructional needs while ensuring continued alignment with provincial goals.
